# ‘Pie It Forward’ sells more than 3,000 pies, raises more than \$200,000

Pie It Forward, the area’s biggest Thanksgiving pie sale, was again a great success, raising more than \$200,000 for Meals on Wheels of the Palm Beaches (MOWPB).

Presented by Bank of America Pie It Forward helped hundreds enjoy a delicious pumpkin, pecan, apple, key lime, blueberry or chocolate peanut butter pie, selling more than 3,000 Thanksgiving pies, including more than 1,000 virtual pies and slices for seniors.
